VENUE FACILITIES



01 — Toilets and Car Parking

Public Toilets and showers are available on-site and are located behind the registration area. Car parking is located behind the Briefing area, along Lou West Oval on King Street and in the car park on Dorset Street.

PADDLER SAFETY



- Clubs are advised to bring their own gazebos for shade. Ensure paddlers have sunscreen, hats and water.
- All canoes to comply with AOCRA specifications. Scrutineering checks will take place on the beach prior to the start of the race briefing.
- All OC6 canoes must carry a PFD for each paddler, a tow rope, and two (2) bailers, flare kit and a spare paddle. The tow rope should be set up for easy deployment.
- OC6 storm covers will be ready to use if required.
- Paddlers are reminded that adequate training for this event is recommended and that all paddlers must be familiar with capsize procedures and have an appropriate level of fitness.
- The Race Director and First Aid post will be located on the beach at the start line with UHF/VHF Radios.
- The correct ratio of tender craft will be on the water and contactable on VHF/UHF radio.
- If we encounter adverse weather conditions on the day the Race Director will either offer a safer alternative course or cancel it entirely according to AOCRA guidelines.
- The alternative course will be at Port Geographe Marina based at Sensations Café beach as in previous Geographe winter events. There is 8km of paddling within Port Geographe Marina.
- 1 Representative from each club to be present while scrutineering takes place.



RACE SAFETY & RIGGING

Standard Race Safety Practices:

- On Water Safety Personnel: there will be a minimum of 4 general safety vessels in attendance, all with VHF radios on board.
- On Land Safety Personnel,
- The Race Director will brief all paddlers prior to each race
- The Finish Line Coordinator will be responsible for accounting for paddlers as they finish the race
- The First Aid Officer will be evident at the First Aid Station throughout the day
- Each OC6 will require 6 x PFDs, a flare kit, towrope, spare steerers' paddle and two bailers.

Communications:

A communications schedule will be circulated to all key stakeholders and emergency services.

- WA Water Police
- Department of Transport (Marine Safety)
- AOCRA (WA Zone)
- Volunteer Marine Rescue (Busselton)
- St Johns Ambulance Service (Busselton)

Shark Response Plan:

Whilst undertaking the activity of Ocean Paddling it is acknowledged that the activity takes place in a dynamic ecosystem in which sharks inhabit. Whilst the risk of shark attack is very low, it is a risk that needs to be accepted by recreational water users when entering the ocean.



Role of event organisers with regards to shark sightings:

If a shark is sighted, event organisers will endeavour to advise all paddlers. A red flag will be raised by safety craft to indicate a shark has been sighted and that the race will continue. The race will continue through the red flag. In this case paddlers are responsible for determining whether to continue on their original course or to head to shore to the nearest safe location.

A black flag will be raised by safety craft if a shark is sighted and deemed to pose a threat. In this circumstance the race will immediately stop and paddlers will be required to exit the water as quickly and safely as possible.

Rigging

Trailers need to be parked out of the way due to the Sailing Regatta on the same day. Rigging will be completed on the beach in front of the club.

Please note cars and trailers are NOT permitted to drive or park on the grass.





ENTRY FEES

Entries and payment are to be completed online via the AOCRA website. AOCRA online registration must be completed on or no later than seven (7) days prior to the event



01 — Senior Paddlers

A seat fee of \$20 per paddler per race applies to the Women's, Men's and Mixed Senior OC6 races. Providing the paddler has registered for one of these events, the Da\$h for Ca\$h will be free of charge.



02— TMC Dash for Cash

Providing the paddler has registered for one of these events, the Da\$h for Ca\$h will be free of charge.

BBQ & Presentations:





01 — Open Women's OC6 10km Marathon




02 — Open Men's 0C6 12km Marathon
